President Report 2012 – 2013 Geoff Jackson (appointed 24 Jan 2013)

The 2012/13 season has once again been and gone. I stepped into this role midway through the season. I want to take the opportunity to thank Ian Waterhouse (former President), Vicki Smyth (former Vice President) & Daryn Apolony (former Director of Administration) for their contributions. We were also fortunate to have two further Club Officers to accept the vacant positions both of whom have a vast amount of Surf Club experience, being, Graeme Doig and Scott Crawford. Having them on the management team has been a great asset and they have both taken on roles to help move us forward to a stronger position in the future.

This season has gone by so fast and we've achieved a lot this year. We've substantially replaced a lot of aging gear and equipment, and we've implemented a substantial amount of renovation and maintenance to the club house in the off season as well as securing tens of thousands of dollars of gym equipment at no cost to the Club. We've also finished the year in a strong financial position due in large part to the platform created by current & previous management teams, & also through being able to lobby for and secure a Federal Government Grant for \$47,500. My objective will be to build further on that substantial record into the future.

I'd like to thank all the Director's & office bearers for their help & support throughout the season. I appreciate all you do. I'd also like to thank our volunteer members who step up and patrol throughout the year, it's a big commitment and responsibility. I'd also like to thank all the other members who help out in various ways to make the club strong, and also their commitment to

making it a fun social place to be. I'd like us all to keep that thought in our minds and remember that we are all volunteers and so owe each other a duty to make this time enjoyable.

I must also acknowledge the following members:

- Kev Boag (Joint Club Person of the Year) – Kev as Director of Surf Sport had a huge task to manage the Inter-Branch Championships this year. This is a State Carnival and highly prestigious for us to have it at Black Head beach. Kev's efforts made this a success and the feedback from State was full of high praise. This was one achievement among many.
- Kellie Connolly (Joint Club Person of the Year) – Kellie took on the position of Treasurer last year and is also an Inter-Branch Beach Coach and Official. She patrols on my Patrol as First Aider, and is always available to assist in other way possible.

- Head to Head Committee (Vicki Smyth, Daryn Apolony & Natalie Carrier) – Another season of success for this event and its obviously becoming a sort after event on the Ocean Swims Calendar.
- Youth Committee – I also want to acknowledge the youth team in our Club headed by Nick Jackson. They started the committee this year and have created some significant initiatives to raise funds and also to help the community. Their outstanding event was a Community Disco for Kindy to Year 6 kids which had 50+ kids turn up. What a great effort.

- The Head2Head swim & ski events were held on 6th January 2013 and was a resounding success. Finishers were 260 in 2013 vs 277 in 2012. This event was very ably run by Vicki Smyth and Daryn Apolony (See report later). Thank you to both of you plus your helpers. As you can see from the financial report this event is a big contributor to our Club funds.
- The Club sponsored the fireworks again on New Year's Eve. This is a great community event which requires greater community financial assistance.

- During the season a newsletter has been distributed electronically to members. This initiative has been well received by the membership but greater contributions from members is required to ensure it continues.

Lifesaving report 2012 – 2013 Geoff Jackson

I want to say thank you to Members for their contribution and support throughout the 2012/13 Patrol Season. The commitment through selfless devotion is what makes a strong community. Congratulations for another successful year.

The Club had a significant reduction in rescues (down approx. 50%) this season due in part to better prevention. This is a great result and comes through better vigilance and observation in large part.

The Club has had to sign a new Lifesaving Service Agreement with NSW SLS and from next year will be required to Patrol a minimum of 5 hours per day 9AM to 2PM during the periods either side of Christmas Holidays.



Surf Sports Report 2012 – 2013 Kevin Boag

Our local carnivals were supported strongly by the nippers and a keen number of seniors at the start of the 2012-13 season, Over 50 competitors from Black Head dealt with a surprisingly large swell pushing in at Crowdy Head, all our competitors were tested in the water and on a shrinking beach resulting from the lack of sand. The junior water events were cancelled due to conditions and the carnival finished with competitors from u15 and older entering the water.

The Black Head carnival was set up as the Interbranch selection carnival with LNC branch's best competing for limited spots in the team. This carnival catered for U12's and up which limited numbers. The Club featured strongly in the team with over ten members competing at Interbranch from Black Head.

One of our most experienced and dedicated competitors Noelene Young travelled to Adelaide on her own early last November to compete at the world titles against others from across the world, Noelene came home with some very impressive results, and her story of that journey is amazing and an inspiration to everyone. Noelene's results in her age group: 1st Board race, 3rd Ocean woman, 3rd Single ski and 3rd Surf swim. Congratulations Noelene, awesome effort.

Organising teams started early with planning for the 2012 Interbranch carnival held at Black Head. With many volunteers starting on the Friday morning before the carnival, most gave up their whole weekend setting up and maintaining fencing, tents, food, IRB's cleaning up rubbish and helping out wherever else they were needed. Thanks to those volunteers, the whole carnival was a great success for the club, with most praise going to the helpers in the kitchen.

The H2H was another great success for our club, held on one of our busiest weekends it had the beach, club and grass area packed with spectators, ski paddlers and swimmers from everywhere. Competitor numbers rise every year and all enjoyed clear conditions and a great atmosphere.

Country Championships were held at South West Rocks again in mid January, 10 competitors from Black Head travelled up and all put in great performances. Noelene Young again showed us how it's done with a 1st in the iron woman and board race and 2nd in the ski and surf swim. Lillian Smyth dominated the board riding again with 1st in the open and U17 short board finals. Jack Nicholson came 1st in the U17 flags and 3rd in the sprint, Jordan Connelly stepped up to opens and finished 3rd in the sprint and 5th in the open flags. Aiden Butcher had a great time finishing 3rd in the U19 sprint and 6th in the open sprint.

State Championships were held at Umina beach on the Central Coast in early March. Noelene Young and Kim Gollan travelled down and were met with dirty messy conditions, Noelene's results were: 1st Board final, 2nd Single Ski final, 2nd Iron woman final, 3rd Tube Race, 3rd Surf Race.

Kim finished 4th 2km Beach Run and 5th in the Board Final.



Junior Activities Report 2012 – 2013 Nick Wisemantel

Once again the Club had an excellent season of Nippers. Nipper membership made a dramatic decline based on the 2011/12 figures of 160 down to a total of approximately 109 Members. The Nipper season ran from the 7th October 2012 to the 24th March 2012. Considering the extreme weather conditions which included two weekends of cyclonic style conditions with which Nippers was cancelled nipper members managed to have some great days on the beach.

A breakdown of Nipper membership is listed below:

U6 -13 members, U7-13 members, U8-15 members, U9-19 members, U10-14 members, U11-11 members, U12-12 members, U13-3 members, U14-9 members.

As can be seen there is a significant decline in Nipper membership as the children become older. An initiative taken by some members of the club this year was to start a youth group / committee, this is aimed at providing a social network for juniors within the club with the aim of retaining the 12-16 Year olds. Retention of youth is an ongoing issue and the committee of BHSLC is open to suggestions as to how this can be addressed within the Club, however, all suggestions must be within the guidelines of NSWSLSA Policy

Black Head Nippers had a very successful year of competition The Crowdy Head Carnival set the standard for the season, although it was a rainy day Black Head Nippers participated in strong numbers and dominated the competition on the beach, unfortunately the ocean conditions turned for the worse and all water events were cancelled.

The LNC Branch Championships were a highlight, after being the runner up to Forster for the past two years Black Head managed to win the Juniors, again there was strong participation and the Nippers displayed high level beach skills and resilience in the water events in tough conditions. I would like to take this opportunity to congratulate all Nippers who participated and thank the parents for supporting this competition.

Water safety is an area of Nippers which needs constant attention and monitoring, this year it proved a challenge, quite often members especially Bronze Medallion holders were not available to assist and the numbers were on the lighter side. The Club will address this issue for the 2012-13 season by offering volunteer Nipper parents the opportunity to complete their Bronze Medallion. This will not only be of benefit to Sunday morning water safety area but also support and bolster patrols. Whilst on the topic of Water safety our SRC membership U14-U16 age group volunteered and supervised very effectively, these members are an invaluable part of supervising the water safety area. The Club and Nippers would like to thank you those members for the support and outstanding displays of skill and commitment to ensure that the Nippers participate in a safe environment. These efforts instill confidence in the minds of the participants and their parents.

The encouragement provided to all participants of the water activities, ensured that everyone achieves success in this important area of our Nipper program.

The NSW SLISA has recently released a new Water Safety Policy, this policy is based upon recommendations made after the recent tragedies within the sport. This policy must be implemented in the upcoming season and strictly followed when Nippers are in the water, this means that parents will be required to become more involved in supporting water activities. The Club needs parents to complete the Bronze Medallion Award so that it can adequately staff the water safety area without leaving it up to just a few.

This year will also see the implementation of all Nippers participating in Water Activities wearing a Fluro Pink Rash Shirt or Singlet. This is a requirement set down in the Water Safety Policy. Nippers will not be able to participate in water activities unless they are wearing the Fluro Pink Shirt / Singlet.

Competition within the Club this season was healthy, three competition days were run and the Nippers all showed outstanding sportsmanship and skills. The Club participated at two local carnivals and won the Crowdy Head Carnival and LNC Branch Championships. Support for this carnival was generally adequate with approximately 50 competitors participating out of a total of 83 qualified competitors. I encourage parents to consider taking their children along to the major carnivals, Black Head Nippers have the skills and ability to be very competitive and it's a nice way to spend a day at the beach with friends and fellow members. This year we also had a considerable number of past and present nippers participate in the Interbranch team. A number of members also entered into the Country Championships and a small number participated at the State Titles and National Titles.

The Age Managers this year have worked tirelessly every Sunday to ensure that nippers have a safe and enjoyable time. The Age managers are volunteers who not only have the interest of their children in mind but all Nippers. It is a very important role within the organisation of Nippers. Without Age Managers, Nippers could not run, parent support of the Age Managers is directly connected to the success of nipper's participation. All parents are encouraged to become actively involved by supporting their children's Age Manager. The club would like to take this opportunity to thank all the Age Managers for their efforts in the past season.
