## **PROPOSAL RE CHANGES TO CONSTITUTION:**

## LIFE MEMBERSHIP AND HONOURS COMMITTEE

A Committee consisting of a Convenor with at least three (3) years of service, two (2) Life Members and two (2) members with at least 12 years of continuous membership is to be elected at the Annual General Meeting. The Convenor is to be given any nominations for Life Membership/Honours. The deliberations of the Committee are to be confidential and the results are to be announced by the President/Convenor at the next Annual General Meeting or at an appropriate Club function.

## **CRITERIA**

Life Membership candidates must either fulfil <u>one</u> of the following categories or a combination of categories with Blackhead Surf Lifesaving Club.

- 1. 18 years of Bronze Medallion Service, 10 years as an Office Bearer or Committee member.
- 2. 22 years of Bronze Medallion service, 12 years as a Patrol Captain. and/or 8 years as an Office Bearer or a combination.
- 3. Exceptional/Special Circumstances/Competition after 15 years of Bronze Medallion Service.

## **HONOUR BLAZER CRITERIA**

Eight (8) years of Bronze Medallion Service with Blackhead Surf Lifesaving Club to include 6 years as an Office Bearer or Committee Member.

Consideration will be given to other activities e.g. competition coaching, fund-raising, club maintenance or administration duties.

All nominations for Life Membership and Honour Blazer are to be proposed and seconded by financial members of the Club. The records of candidates are to include all appropriate dates for awards gained.

## NOTE 1: STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act NSW and the NSW Charitable Fundraising Act and Regulations. The Committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act NSW and the NSW Charitable Fundraising Act and Regulations and the following Australian Accounting Standards.

AAS5 Materiality

AAS8 Events Occurring After Reporting Date

No other applicable Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Board have been applied.

The financial report has been prepared on a cash basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values, or except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

The following material accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

#### a) Fixed Assets

Freehold land and buildings are brought to account at cost or at independent or committee valuation.

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets are depreciated over the useful lives of the assets to the association commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use.

## 2. STATEMENT SHOWING HOW FUNDS RECEIVED WERE APPLIED TO CHARITABLE PURPOSES

Net Fundraising income for the period amounted to \$13,509. An amount of \$28,396 was received from Donations, \$6,199 from Hall & Equipment Hire, \$9,050, from Members' Subscriptions, Sale of Clothing \$4,896, \$21,319 from Bar Takings, and \$61 from Bank Interest. Other income totalled \$7,911.

These funds were applied to: maintenance of the club house and equipment \$5,473; insurance \$7,973; bar purchases \$13,727, clothing purchases, \$6,652, depreciation \$20,646; and other expenses totalling \$31,090 to club activities and other running costs. Capital expenditure amounted to \$16,834, loan repayments \$2,534 and \$2,638 of bar purchases remain on hand.

#### INDEPENDENT AUDIT REPORT

# TO THE MEMBERS OF BLACK HEAD SURF LIFE SAVING CLUB INCORPORATED

#### Scope

We have audited the financial report, being a special purpose financial report comprising Statement by Members of the Committee, Income and Expenditure Statement, Balance Sheet and Notes to the Financial Statements of the Black Head Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated for the period 1 July 2003 to 30 April 2004. The Committee is responsible for the financial report and has determined that the accounting policies used and described in Note 1 to the financial statements which form part of the financial report are appropriate to meet the needs of the Associations Incorporation Act NSW and the NSW Charitable Fundraising Act 1991 and the needs of the members. We have conducted an independent audit of the financial report in order to express an opinion on it to the members of the Black Head Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated. No opinion is expressed as to whether the accounting policies used, and described in Note 1, are appropriate to the needs of the members.

The financial report has been prepared for the purpose of fulfilling the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act NSW and the NSW Charitable Fundraising Act 1991 and Regulations. We disclaim any assumption of responsibility for any reliance on this report or on the financial report to which it relates to any person other than the members, or for any purpose other than that for which it is prepared.

Our audit has been conducted in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. Our procedures included examination, on a test basis, of evidence supporting the amounts and other disclosures in the financial report, and the evaluation of significant accounting estimates. These procedures have been undertaken to form an opinion as to whether, in all material respects, the financial report is presented fairly in accordance with the accounting policies described in Note 1 to the financial statements. These policies do not require application of all Australian Accounting Standards and other mandatory professional reporting requirements in Australia.

The audit opinion expressed in this report has been formed on the above basis.

#### Qualification

Cash donations are a significant source of revenue for the association. The committee has determined that it is impractical to establish controls over the collection of cash donations until they are entered in the accounting records. Accordingly, as evidence available to us regarding revenue from this source was limited, our audit procedures in regard to cash donations were restricted to the amounts recorded in the financial records, We are therefore unable to independently verify whether the amounts received from this source have been completely accounted for.





#### **Qualified Audit Opinion**

In our opinion, subject to the effect, if any, of the matters referred to in the preceding paragraph, the financial report presents fairly in accordance with the accounting policies described in Note 1 to the financial report, the financial position of the Black Head Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated as at 30 April 2004 and the results of the operations for the period then ended.

#### We also report that:

- a) the financial statements present fairly the financial result of fundraising appeals conducted during the year;
- b) the accounting and associated records have been properly kept during the year in accordance with the Charitable Fundraising Act 1991 and the Regulations;
- c) money received as a result of fundraising appeals conducted during the year has been properly accounted for and applied in accordance with the Charitable Fundraising Act 1991 and the Regulations; and
- d) at the date of this report, there are reasonable grounds to believe that the club will be able to pay its debts as and when they fall due.

#### JUNIOR ACTIVITIES CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT

The 2003/2004 season saw once again very solid numbers within our nipper ranks totalling 143 members. Although, at times, these numbers have stretched our equipment resources, the dedication & co-operation between our age managers and their assistants, has seen the season run smoothly and efficiently.

Financially the club is in a very sound position. On the club's behalf, I recently mailed 95 fundraising and sponsorships letters within the community and with minimal follow-up at this time we have secured 6 new Infront Board sponsors, \$700-00 in donations and several pledges of items to include in next years raffle. These boards will be ordered and signwritten during the off-season and be ready for the 2004 season.

Our Insurance costs remain the club's biggest financial burden. All parents should note that our insurance costs for each nipper this year were \$14.10, which is barely covered by the membership fees of \$20.00. This buffer is further minimised when we take into account that no nipper pays entry fees to any carnival. (Branch carnival fees were \$13.50 per nipper). So, when taking this into consideration, it is easy to see the importance of the club's fundraising activities through the weekly BBQ and annual raffle. All parents in the coming season will be looked to, for assistance & greater support in the both the running, management and promotion of these key fundraising activities.

Nippers continues to provide a great social medium and healthy activity for both kids and parents, and I encourage all parents to look towards next season and to promote their child's continuance of attending nippers especially in the older age groups were traditionally we have seen numbers reduce at ages 13 & 14. To support this, the new management committee will be looking at ways in which we can make the activities in these age groups both more interesting, challenging and socially attractive. Ideas are welcome from both Nippers and parents on the subject.

Black Head's competition results this year again confirmed the outstanding abilities and skills that our Nippers have. Most importantly and pleasing was the respect and sportsmanship shown, not only within their age groups and team but towards other competitors. All nippers who attended carnivals are to be congratulated as they did themselves and our club proud. For next season it is my desire to see prior to each carnival a minimum of 2 Carnival Squad training days to familiarise all team members with the rules and regulations as well as opportunities to practice within their competition teams. I also hope to establish a regular midweek Squad training afternoon. To facilitate this, however, the club will need more qualified level 1 coaches and parents with bronzes for water safety.

I finally would like to reiterate to all members and parents that being involved with the management of the club does not require any special abilities. Most roles are not time consuming and require just a basic knowledge of process and procedure which is easily learnt whilst within the role. Any parent interested in obtaining their coaching certificate, their bronze medallion to assist with water safety, becoming an age manager, or who would like to assist anywhere within the club, please do not be afraid to come and talk to me. You will be most welcomed.
