This year, in late summer, our metal was tested by a fatality on the beach. Occurring outside patrol hours, our team member Jessie Summerville displayed selfless courage and absolute professionalism in rescuing and resuscitating two other people in the group. The informal albeit highly effective bush telegraph that afternoon resulted in the instant rallying of Club Members to the search and rescue effort. In an emotional moment, the Club displayed discipline, cool headed co-operation and support for one another. We commend also the public contribution, particularly the counseling resource provided to the distressed party. On behalf of the Club, our hearts go out to the young man's family and friends.

The front cover of this year's annual report proudly boasts the recent additions to our Clubhouse. Only through the voluntary efforts of many people did this happen. To Mike Bartlett, John Edstein; all the trades' people and the Club Members who gave up their time to help, thank you for your special contribution.

Time and help is the constant, selfless contribution of our Club Management Committee. My heart felt thanks for their effort and support over the last few years. I am proud to serve with this team and we are indebted to them for their initiative and energy.

80 years is a lifetime: But our Club is 80 years young! Support for one another, keeping abreast of new skills and passing on experience and attitude from one generation to the next is the heart of our small community and the soul of Black Head Surf Life Saving Club. HON. SECRETARY'S REPORT 2005-06

Again, this year saw an efficient patrolling team on the beach. Our nine patrols, under the watchful eye of our Lifesaving Director, Jim Crookston, performed many hours of voluntary work and kept the surfing public safe. Unfortunately, Black Head Beach had its first drowning late one Saturday in February, outside patrol hours.

Our bronze squads were kept busy by the Chief Instructor, Paul Kremer. Paul presented a number of candidates of high standard who gained the bronze medallion and were inducted into the regular patrols. (See member details elsewhere in this Annual Report.)

John Wilson, our IRB Captain, spent a great deal of time and effort during the season on maintaining and upgrading our equipment. John also supervised the training of a large number of IRB drivers and crew persons which will greatly expand our patrolling capacity and efficiency next season. (See member details elsewhere.)

The very generous donation of the Defibrillator from the Taree North Rotary Club last year saw a number of members qualify to be able to use this equipment. (See member details elsewhere.)

The Nippers, under the direction of Warren Wysocki, had another successful season and our thanks is extended to Warren for all his hard work. George Greaves has taken over from Warren and we wish George every success in the coming season.

The Club has upgraded a great deal of equipment this season with our own funds but we were helped by:

- ** Coastline Credit Union who donated a new IRB motor;
- ** Greater Taree City Council who provided funds through the Section 94 Development Levy to buy equipment. This money was spent on new Radios and Rescue Boards which were presented to the Club by Mayor Eddie Loftus.

Our building programme received a healthy start early in the season when Black Head was awarded a grant of \$127,000.00 by the Department of Sport & Recreation. These funds have enabled the Building Committee to erect a magnificent extension to our clubhouse. The Building Committee members are Bruce Dayment, Terry Aldridge, Mark Miller, John Wilson, Jim Crookston and Mike Bartlett. The Committee first met on October 13th 2005 and work commenced on 22nd October when the old stairs were removed and the foundations dug.

LIFESAVING REPORT

This is my first season as Director of Lifesaving. In a blink, the season has come and gone but with fresh eyes I observe the vigilance and dedication of our patrols. Reflected in the attendance records this year guys, we notched up some 2800 hours! To the nine patrol Captains, thank you for your commitment and professionalism.

This year, the "Bronze Medallion" got a new name. Formally referred to and recognized now as a Certificate (II) in Public Safety (aquatic rescue) it is interesting that as the proficiency gets tougher, the Club gets going: An increase in active patrol members from 73 to 94; the upgrade of all our patrol members to the new qualification requiring a formal review process and two new Cert (II) squads trained and actively participating in patrol duties.

I am enormously encouraged by the feed back from the attending certificate (II) assessors who indicate clearly that Blackhead is leading the way with the high level of candidates sitting the exams. This reflects directly on the professionalism, experience and commitment of Blackheads Chief Instructor Paul Kremer and his Instructors in Training Graham Tilbrook and Warren Wysocki. Nice work guys! Thank you also to Noelene, Kim and Deb for their assistance and encouragement with the Saturday morning sessions.

I would encourage member, Nipper parents and age managers to consider doing the Cert (II) course. Contact Paul for details of up and coming squads. The Cert (II) squads take approx 5-6 weeks to complete, two nights a week and one Saturday morning and the guys have a great time.

In past years we have struggled to provide IRB support for each patrol. With the training of 8 new drivers and crew this season, were back in business thanks to our off-season signing of former Club President John "Wilso" Wilson.

Professionalism and standards are paramount to our effectiveness and what better way to measure this than competitively. Blackhead Bowling Club and Tags Restaurant were the generous sponsors of our patrol competition this season. This included regular, formal inspection of each patrol that was required to perform rescue scenarios. Logbooks, patrol gear and uniforms were included and points awarded to each patrol for their performance. It was great to see how close the competition was and the excellent way the Captains and Patrol members performed their duties.



We are therefore unable to confirm whether the cash amounts received have been recorded in their entirety.

There were several items of expenditure unsupported by documentary evidence and we were unable to confirm the absolute integrity of all expenditure.

The audit opinion expressed in this report has been formed on the above basis.

Subject to the above limitations, the financial report is drawn up so as to exhibit a true and fair view of the operations of the organisation for the year ended 30 April 2006 and the position as at that date, according to the books of account and information supplied.
