### Black Head Surf Life Saving Club Objectives

(a) Provide for the conduct, encouragement, promotion, and administration of surf lifesaving in the local area.

(b) Participate as a member of SLSNSW and SLSA through and by which surf lifesaving and the preservation of life in the aquatic environment can be conducted, encouraged, promoted, advanced and administered.

(c) Ensure the maintenance and enhancement of the Club, and surf lifesaving, its standards, quality and reputation for the benefit of the members and surf lifesaving.

(d) At all times act on behalf of and in the interest of the members and surf lifesaving.

(e) Promote the economic and community service success, strength and stability of surf lifesaving.

(f) Affiliate with and otherwise liaise with SLSNSW and SLSA in the pursuit of these objects and surf lifesaving.

(g) Conduct, encourage, promote, advance, and control surf lifesaving in the local area, its many aspects devoted to aquatic safety and management, and the preservation of life in the aquatic environment.

(h) Apply the property and capacity of the Club towards the fulfilment and achievement of these objects.

(i) Promote the involvement and influence of surf lifesaving standards, techniques, awards and education with bodies involved in lifesaving.

(j) Strive for Governmental, commercial, and public recognition of the Club as the authority on aquatic safety and management in local area.

(k) Foster, regulate, organise, and manage assessments, competitions, displays and other activities and to issue badges, medallions and certificates and award trophies to successful members.

(I) Review and/or determine any matters relating to surf lifesaving which may arise, or be referred to it, by any Member.

(m) Represent the interests of its members and of surf lifesaving generally in any appropriate forum in



## **Categories of Club Membership:**

(a) **Probationary Members** shall be the designation of any person for the time between applying for membership and the granting of a formal category of membership of the Club. Probationary Members are non-voting members of the Club.

(b) **Junior Activities Members** shall be a person who shall be a minimum age of five (5) years and up to a maximum age of thirteen (13) years and such person shall be required to gain the relevant Surf EducationCertificate for that person's age group. Junior Activities Members are non-voting members of the Club.

(c) **Cadet Members** shall be a Member of the age qualification as defined in SLSA's Manuals (i.e. Under 15) and who has obtained the Surf Rescue Certificate or has passed the annual proficiency test. Cadet Members are non-voting members of the Club.

(d) **Active Members**, who shall hold an SLSA Bronze Medallion, fulfil patrol and Club obligations and qualify in anannual proficiency test (unless that Member has obtained their Bronze Medallion in that season). Active Members shall have the right to be present, to debate and to vote at General Meetings.

(e) **Reserve Active Membership** may be granted to Active Members who have satisfactorily completed (from gaining the Bronze Medallion) at least eight (8) years of patrol and Club obligations as provided by SLSA and Club Constitution. Reserve Active Membership shall not be automatic but shall be granted by a resolution of the Board. Reserve Active Members shall have the right to be present, to debate and to vote at General Meetings.

(f) **Long Service Members** may be deemed as such <u>by the Club</u> after having completed ten (10) years active service or eight (8) years active service plus four (4) years reserve active service. These Members shall have theright to be present, to debate and to vote at General Meetings, and may be exempt from patrol obligations andgranted other special privileges.

(g) **Award Members** must hold an SLSA award of one or more of the following qualifications: Surf Rescue Certificate, Radio Award, Resuscitation Certificate, Advance Resuscitation Certificate or First Aid Certificate. Award Members may be granted voting rights by the Club Board if they are undertaking lifesaving patrol duties.

(h) **Associate Members**, who may or may not have an SLSA award. Associate Members shall not have voting rights unless elected to office or position, which is provided voting rights by this Constitution.

(i) **Honorary Members** may be granted to Members who may or may not hold an SLSA award. Honorary Members are non-voting members of the Club.

(j) **Life Membership** may be granted by the Club to Members who have rendered distinguished, or specialservice and shall have the right to be present, to debate and to vote at General meetings.

the Council's public toilets, the dungeon under the Surfclub, a new patrol trailer, and security cameras.


This year has seen the introduction of drones on the beach and Suzie will discuss their use below.



## **Membership Trends (2021)**











## **Unmanned Aerial Vehicles (UAV) or drone**

All North Coast locations were operational for the Winter School Holiday in July up to and including Forster – manned by the NSW UAV Service.

We were on patrol and flying every day throughout the holidays, although the weather had other ideas.

Operating conditions have been tough for staff and volunteers due to adverse weather reducing visibility, there are still key benefits to having our UAVs up in the air as we can assist with a variety



of taskings in addition to our usual shark monitoring operations.

UAV's were also utilised in the Flood Rescue/Relief throughout NSW, with the LNC assisting in and around the Maitland area.

The NSW UAV program will maintain patrols during school holidays throughout the year in conjunction with the LNC UAV's.

SLSA UAV service has recently opened recruitment for these areas, and whilst there are limited UAV Operator positions available for new staff, everyone is encouraged to submit an EOI to join in on the training programs available. **ack Head Members that are licenced operators are:**

### Rules for recreational drone operators

You must not fly your drone higher than 120 metres (400 feet) above ground level.

You must keep your drone at least 30 metres away from other people.

You must only fly one drone at a time. You must keep your drone within visual line-of-sight. This means always being able to see the drone with your own eyes (rather than through a <u>device, screen or goggles</u>).

You must not fly over or above people or in a <u>populous area</u>. This could include beaches, parks, events, or sport ovals where there is a game in progress.

Respect personal privacy. Don't record or photograph people without their consent – this may breach other laws.

Use a <u>drone safety app</u> to find out where you can and can't fly.

Remember, you must not operate your drone in a way that creates a hazard to another aircraft, person or property.

You must only fly during the day and you must not fly through cloud or fog.

You must not fly your drone over or near an area affecting public safety or where <u>emergency operations</u> are underway. This could include situations such as a car crash, police operations, a fire or firefighting efforts, or search and rescue.

If you're near a helicopter landing site or smaller aerodrome without a control tower, you can fly your drone within 5.5 kilometres. If you become aware of manned aircraft nearby, you must manoeuvre away and land your drone as quickly and safely as possible.

If you intend to fly your drone for or at work (commercially), there are extra rules you must follow. You will also need to <u>register your drone</u> and get a <u>licence</u> or <u>accreditation</u>.

It is important to remember when comparing the perceived imbalance between preventative actions against rescues is our purpose on the beach. Prevention will always be better than the cure; it means the Patrol Members are doing their function properly by ensuring safety is not compromised. Sadly, 4 rescues were required out of patrol times and involved inexperienced victims who did not recognising the dangers associated with the surf environment. All rescues successfully actioned with no loss of life.

I would particularly like to recognise the actions of Calum Boag, Izaac Boag, Matt Miller, Joel Flemming, James Williams, Joel Flemming, Jayme Wisemantel and Nick Wisemantel for their vigilance, courage and selfless determination displayed during a rescue of a mother and son at Black Head on Tuesday 11 January 2022, around 6pm. The sea and surf conditions were horrendous and, working together, they achieved a successful rescue. Two people are alive today because of their bravery. Thank you.

The involvement of the Education Team comprising Nick Wisemantel, Peter McErlain, Kevin Boag and Suzanne Gerrish provided the drive to ensure our members were trained and or up-skilled. This support provided our Club with new Bronze Members, SRC Members, IRB Drivers and Crew, new or Upgrade of First Aid, as well as new and or upgrade of Advanced Resuscitation. Black Head also an additional 4 members with the Silver Medallion Aquatic Rescue award.

Visitor numbers fluctuated throughout the season due to health concerns and weather however, overall numbers on the beach were reasonably high.

We have the benefit of a new IRB hull which will be launched in the coming season. We have two motors that are a little worse for wear but, with appropriate management we will secure a new motor in the coming season. Gear and equipment are in good shape and serviceable. First Aid supplies will be replenished before the commencement of the 2022 season.

I extend my thanks to the Board of Black Head SLSC, our members and my wife Suzanne Gerrish for their continued support and encouragement. A particular thanks is extended to David & Cathy Bowland for their guidance, support and encouragement.

I believe we successfully delivered an exemplary response in keeping the beach and surf zone safe, for which we can be justifiably proud. I am confident that Black Head SLSC will continue to be the strongest and most innovative surf club in the Lower North Coast Branch. We have an amazing team that works collaboratively and collectively to ensure the safety of our community and visitors to our piece of paradise. I am honoured and privileged to have been given the opportunity by the Black Head Board of Management and the Members to serve as the Director of Life Saving. ### 2022 LNCSLS Branch Points Score





### 21-22 Season Junior Activities Annual Report

We kicked off our season on Sunday 05 December with 102 nippers registered from U6's to U14's. Nearly two months behind our usual start date due to Covid. Numbers were down from previous year. Our younger age groups are still strong in numbers. Majority of our recruits are local but we do have participants from the greater Manning area such as Coolongolook, Nabiac, Bulahdelah, Wingham, Strathcedar, Taree and Cundletown.
